OUR SERVICES INCLUDE



SKILLED NURSING:

Skilled nursing focused on pain and symptom management, medication oversight, wound care, and care coordination.



CERTIFIED HOME HEALTH AIDE:

Certified Home Health Aide support with personal care, hygiene, mobility, comfort measures, and emotional support and companionship for patients and families.



MEDICAL SOCIAL WORKERS:

Medical Social Workers provide emotional support, counseling, care coordination, and assistance with resources for patients and families.



CHAPLAIN / SPIRITUAL:

Chaplain/Spiritual services providing for patients' spiritual needs, offering comfort, guidance, and bereavement support for families.

LEVELS OF CARE



ROUTINE HOME CARE

This is the most common level of hospice care. Our team visits patients at home, assisted living, or a facility to manage symptoms, provide comfort, and support both patients and families.



CONTINUOUS HOME CARE

When symptoms become severe or a crisis arises, continuous home care provides short-term, around-the-clock nursing support to ensure patient comfort and safety.



INPATIENT CARE

For intense symptom management, patients receive care in a hospice facility, hospital, or skilled nursing unit with full medical and emotional support.



RESPIRE CARE

Provides a short stay in a facility to give family caregivers a rest, while the patient continues to receive attentive care.

MEDICATIONS, MEDICAL EQUIPMENT, & SUPPLIES PROVIDED

Hospice provides all medications, equipment, and supplies needed for comfort and symptom management at home.

VOLUNTEER SERVICES

Our volunteers provide companionship, emotional support, and assistance to both patients and families, helping make every day more comfortable and meaningful.

HOLISTIC PATIENT CARE

We provide compassionate care for the whole person, incorporating meditation, gentle touch, visualization, affirmations, and love to support both body and spirit.



WHO IS HOSPICE CARE FOR?

Hospice care is for individuals with a life-limiting illness who seek comfort-focused care, pain and symptom management, and emotional and spiritual support for both patients and their families.

WHO IS QUALIFIED FOR HOSPICE CARE?

Hospice care is available to individuals with a life-limiting illness who have a physician's certification and a life expectancy of six months or less, and who choose comfort-focused care rather than curative treatment.

WILL THERE BE A NEED FOR A NEW PHYSICIAN?

In addition to the support of the Hospice Medical Director, patients may choose to continue seeing their primary care physician.

WHERE IS HOSPICE PROVIDED?

Hospice care is provided wherever the patient calls home, including private residences, assisted living communities, and skilled nursing facilities.

HOW IS HOSPICE PAID FOR?

Hospice care is typically covered by Medicare, Medicaid, and most private insurance plans, with little to no out-of-pocket cost to the patient or family.
